Creature Feature: Tropical Parula

This little warbler was all the rage last month, as dedicated birders flocked to the refuge in hopes of sighting the rare Tropical Parula that was photographed at our popular bird blind. A common resident of the tropics in Northern Mexico and as far south as Argentina, this little bird has all but vanished from the Rio Grande Valley, making each sighting a memorable experience as it occasionally ventures into our area during the winter months. They are brilliantly colored, with a blueish gray and olive colored back and a bright yellow throat and chest. Feeding off a steady diet of insects, the Tropical Parula spends most of its time in the dense forest canopy, while at times enjoying a cool bath in some of our water features. They prefer to nest in Spanish moss deep in heavily wooded oak forests, while they will also build their nests in epiphytes such as orchids or climbing cacti. The female broods three to four eggs in a hollowed out nest, and the male is not significantly involved in the chick rearing process. If you are fortunate enough to spot one of these beauties, you will not likely forget the amazing experience. This photo was captured by Mary Volz at our bird blind!
